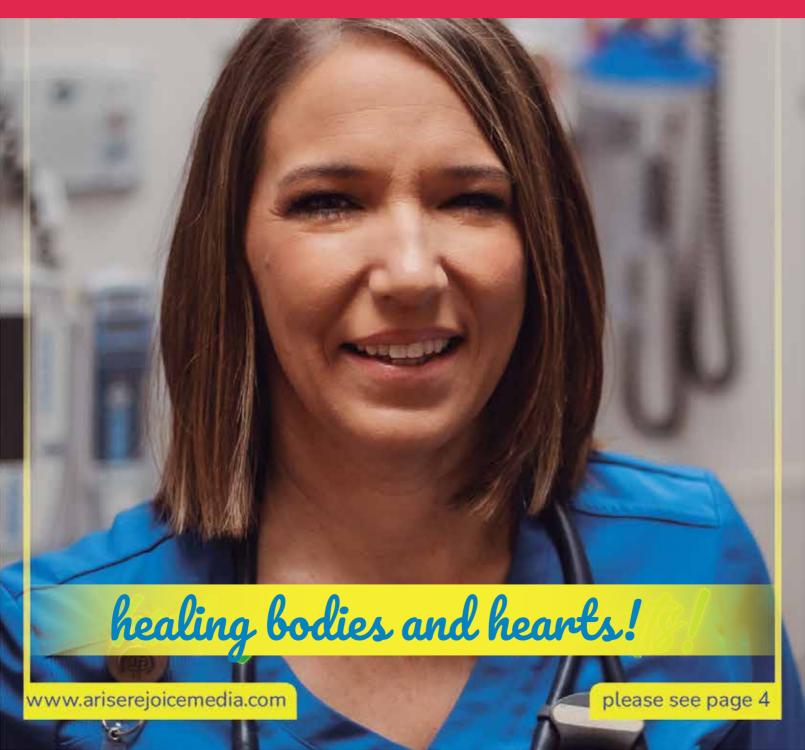
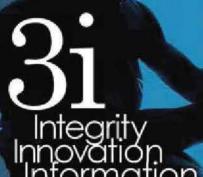

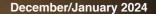
"love inviting friends, colleagues and family members to join us on medical mission trips," said Ms. Stewart who was accompanied on one trip by her daughter.

AVOIDING DRY EYES

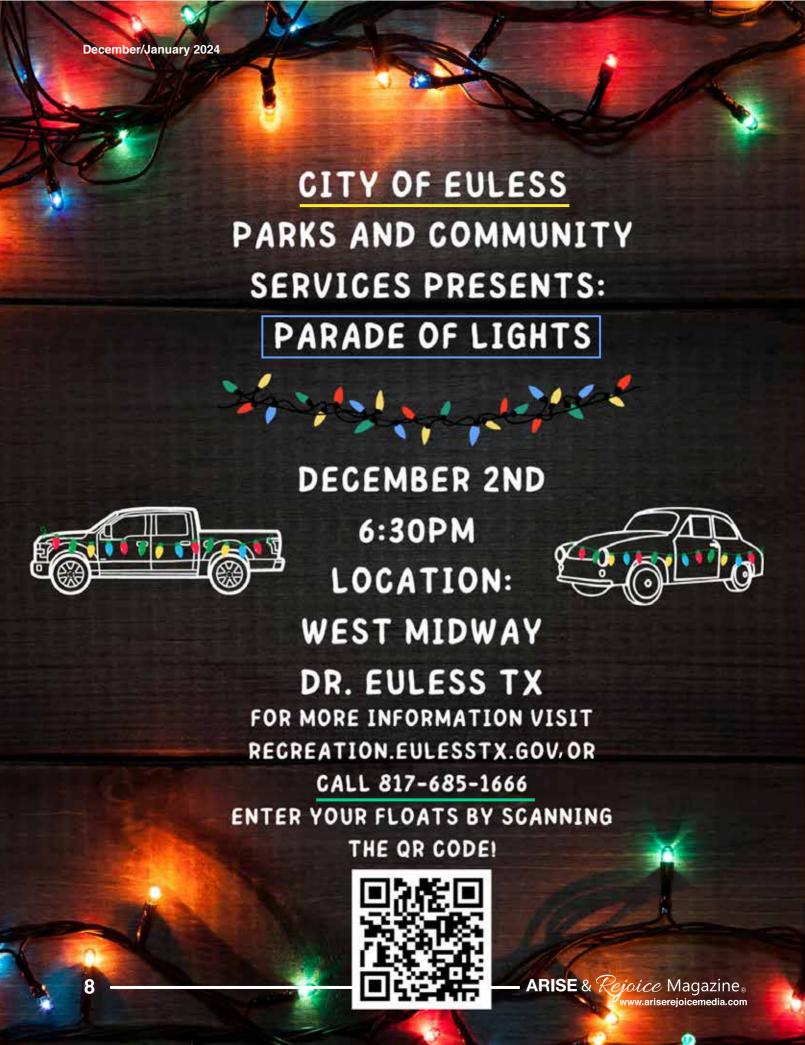

hecking your blood pressure regularly is crucial to quality health. High blood pressure and low pressure can lead to problems that you don't want to encounter. Here are some things to consider to stay well!

UNDERSTANDING PAIN:

Persistent pain in parts of your body may lead to higher blood pressure.

If pain is constant see your health professional to determine the cause of the discomfort.

Do not try to beat the pain by being tough. Stubbornness can often land you in the graveyard!

EAT FRUITS AND VEGET ABLES:

Do not grow weary of eating fruits and vegetables!
They are good for you, and will help keep your blood pressure in order.

Stay away from salt if you can, and try to avoid canned foods. Also, try eating a grapefuit once each day. Some health professionals say that eating grapefruit will help normalize your blood pressure.

ALWAYS EMPTY YOUR BLADDER:

If your bladder is full and you have an urge to go to the bathroom check your blood pressure as it may be high.

If you are going to dinner or for a long car ride, empty your bladder first. When you are at your doctor's office go to the bathroom before the nurse gets started! JAR
